Nursery

This term Nursery have got a focus on growing. They have been learning about butterflies and the life cycle of a butterfly. They are able to raise a caterpillar to watch it cocoon and then watch it transform into a Butterfly. They will then release them. Nursery have also been rhyming and watching the hungry caterpillar. In the outside area, they have been spending time playing with the ball each other. They have been growing flowers, and inspecting different minibeasts and what they sound like aswell as where you might find them. Nursery have been using natural materials to create artwork.

Reception are also learning about growing too. They have been spending more time outdoors looking at what is growing. They have a green house to grow flowers in. When they plant their seeds, they will take a photo every day to see how much it has grown. In maths, they have been looking at composition of numbers and adding numbers together.
