Home reading	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Please record home comments / messages in the reading diary. <i>(Reading in school is recorded separately.)</i></li><li>Please listen to them read but also take time to read to them.</li></ul>
Number club	This will be sent home on <i>Friday</i> after it has been completed in school in order to correct errors for the next week's club.
Spellings	Spellings will be sent home on <i>Tuesday</i> and will be tested on the following <i>Tuesday</i> .
Enrichment tasks	These are based on the subjects the children are learning about and can be found on the Parent Curriculum Overview.

- Fluency and speed when reading and using our phonetic strategies to support us when we come across an unfamiliar word.
- Comprehension lessons will include a focus on VIPERS skills, a range of different genres and answering questions which are presented in different ways.

# Maths:

The maths curriculum is built of two main areas – arithmetic and reasoning.

In order to develop their arithmetical skills, the children have a weekly arithmetic lesson and rapid recall skills are rehearsed throughout the week.

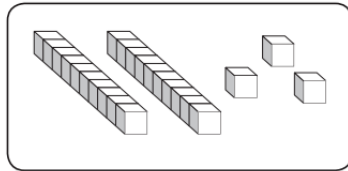
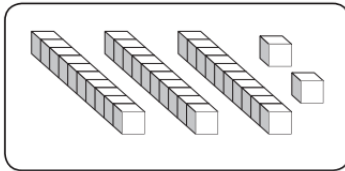
