Writing:

Writing comprises of different key areas:

- Spelling
- Handwriting
- Composition
- Vocabulary, Grammar and Punctuation

Maths:

The maths curriculum is built of two main areas – arithmetic and reasoning.

In order to develop their arithmetical skills, the children have a weekly arithmetic lesson and rapid recall skills are rehearsed throughout the week.

To support the children in developing their rapid recall of number facts, number clubs will be tested and sent home weekly. These match to maths targets which can be found along with other resources on the school website:

On the next slide are examples of questions the children may be asked to complete as part of their reasoning lessons.




Maths:

Dani thinks that 12,000 g is greater than 20 kg because 12,000 > 20


Do you agree?

Explain your answer.



- A is an odd integer that rounds to 100,000 to the nearest 10,000
- The sum of the digits of A is 30
- B is an even integer that rounds to 500,000 to the nearest 100,000
- The sum of the digits of B is 10
- A and B are both multiples of 5

What could be the values of A and B?
